Betsy Child

Betsy Child is Chief of Staff at UCOR with responsibility for coordinating the resources required to deliver the President's operational vision and support achievement of DOE-related corporate goals and missions.

A former Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Betsy also serves as UCOR's Chief Regulatory Officer, overseeing the Environmental Stewardship Program. She leads the company's relationships with its diverse stakeholders, including state and federal regulatory agencies, community organizations and elected officials. A Director with UCOR's Small Business Partner, RSI, Betsy's management portfolio is rounded out by her additional role in overseeing UCOR's Communications and Community Programs office.

Betsy is currently a loaned executive from Restoration Services, Inc. (RSI), UCOR's lead subcontractor. RSI is an employee-owned company with more than 17 years of experience in characterizing the East Tennessee Technology Park site and ensuring State and Federal regulatory compliance in demolition operations. Betsy continues to serve as the RSI liaison to the DOE EM reindustrialization efforts.

Prior to joining RSI, Betsy was President and Owner of Geothermal Utilities and Strategic EcoPartners Consulting, providing professional consulting services for federal, state and commercial environmental regulatory issues, energy efficiency and renewable energy opportunities. She also advised clients on strategic business development, public policy issues and implementation of renewable energy initiatives.

Betsy previously served as the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation where she managed a workforce of 3,200 employees and an annual budget of \$290 million. Appointed by the Governor, Betsy was responsible for all EPA-delegated programs in the state, including land, water and air and governance of the State Parks system. She also had oversight of the state's Historic Commission and the environmental cleanup of the Department of Energy's Oak Ridge Reservation.

Earlier, Betsy served as a senior executive officer for the Tennessee Valley Authority, beginning as Vice President of Community Partnerships, an economic development program supported by federal appropriations. She was later designated to lead the consolidation of all TVA economic development programs and was promoted to serve as Senior VP of the overall TVA economic development operation. At the time, TVA earned the distinction of being recognized as one of the top 10 economic development organizations in the country by Site Selector Magazine; created and published the internationally recognized magazine, Economic Edge; and established a \$100 million loan fund to support growth of existing industry throughout the seven-state Valley region.

Having served more than 30 years in top-level management positions in both public and private sectors, Betsy brings a wealth of senior executive experience in diverse markets. She holds both Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Middle Tennessee State University.
