ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY STATEMENT

UCOR LLC is committed to incorporating sound environmental management, protection, sustainability, and justice considerations in all its business decisions, work processes, and activities that are part of our U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Contract. The environmental policy provides a framework for setting environmental objectives and includes a commitment to continually improve the environmental performance of our operations. Our commitment to protect and sustain human, natural, and cultural resources is inherent in our mission to complete environmental cleanup safely with reduced risks to the public, workers, and the environment.

UCOR implements an Environmental Management System (EMS) as part of its existing Integrated Safety Management System. Using a graded approach appropriate for a closure and remediation contract, the EMS incorporates performance goals and provides a unified strategy for the management and protection of natural resources, the control and attenuation of risks, the prevention of pollution, the acquisition of sustainable products and services, and the establishment and attainment of all environmental, safety and health requirements. UCOR works continuously to improve our EMS and environmental performance and to communicate and reinforce this policy to our internal and external stakeholders.

ENVIRONMENTAL PRINCIPLES

UCOR adopts the following business principles in support of our environmental policy.

Leadership Commitment

- Integrate responsible environmental practices into project operations by identifying environmental aspects, establishing environmental objectives and targets, measuring progress, and reporting performance through a comprehensive EMS.
- Comply with all requirements of the Tennessee Hazardous Waste Reduction Act including the development of an annual waste reduction plan that outlines the specific waste reduction goals as applicable, and tracks progress toward these goals.
- Factor environmental considerations and sustainability into project decisions that are appropriate for the nature and extent of our activities.
- Educate employees on their environmental responsibilities, expect them to use effective environmental compliance and protection processes, and hold them accountable for their performance.

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Environmental Compliance and Protection

- Comply with all environmental laws, regulations and permits, including applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements for projects conducted pursuant to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act.
- Assess the effects of operations on the environment through a comprehensive environmental monitoring program.
- Practice responsible environmental stewardship for the natural and cultural resources in and around facility operations.
- Operate with a goal of continuous improvement.

Sustainable Environmental Stewardship

- Minimize the effects of our operations on the environment through a combination of source reduction, recycling and reuse, sound waste management practices, and pollution prevention.
- Procure products and services that minimize or eliminate environmental impacts.
- Maximize the acquisition and use of environmentally preferable products and services.
- Conserve water, energy, fuel, and other raw materials.

Partnerships/Stakeholder Involvement

- Maintain partnerships through effective two-way communications with our customer and other stakeholders (e.g., the public, Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Tennessee Valley Authority, Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency).
- Solicit and respond to input during the public participation process.
- Communicate open and honestly with all stakeholders.
