Tom Dieter is the Chief Operating Officer (COO) for UCOR. He has more than 30 years of senior project and program management experience in large, complex nuclear enterprise operations, specifically end-state-focused decommissioning and environmental remediation on a national scale.

A hallmark of Tom's leadership is his customer and labor-centric focus. He successfully managed both DOE cleanup and commercial decommissioning projects with budgets of nearly \$3 billion. Those projects included oversight of more than 2,700 union and non-union employees, more than 20 subcontractors, and regulatory agency relationships at all levels. Tom's end-state leadership experience includes five years as president and CEO of the \$2.9 billion Idaho Cleanup Project and three years as deputy program manager of the \$1.6 billion successor contract.

Tom is an industry-leading reactor and high-risk nuclear facility decommissioning expert. He has overseen decommissioning of five commercial power generating and government-owned test reactors, three large, high hazard, plutonium and uranium production facilities, three spent fuel ponds, and dozens of nuclear operations support facilities. All of this work is directly relevant to the Oak Ridge Reservation cleanup.

Tom received a diploma in Nondestructive Examination from Ridgewater College and has had construction management coursework from Boise State University.
